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Cipla launches generic Hepatitis C drug Hepcvir

NEW DELMI: Cipla, on Wednesday, announced the launch of generic drug Sofosbuvir for treating chronic Hepatitis C under the brand name Hepcvir.

"Sofusbuvir marks a new era of medicines in oral treatment of Hepatitis C, which reduce the need for injectables," Cipla Chief Medical Officer Jaideep Gogtay said.

In India alone, around 12-18 million patients are estimated to be infected with Hepatitis C, which is several fold greater than those with HIV/AIDS, Cipla said.

Earlier this week, Dr. Reddy's Laboratories has entered into an agreement with Hetero to distribute and market generic version of U.S.-firm Gilead Sciences' Hepatitis C drug under the brand Resof. - PTI
