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Sun Recalls 4 Lakh Bottles of Cephalexin from US



MUMEAT India's largest drug maker Sun Pharmaceutical has voluntarily recalled close to four lakh units of its anti-bacterial drug Cephalexin

from the US market for not following good manufacturing practices, according to an information put up by the US Food & Drug Administration. The batch of 500mg and 250 mg were recalled from Sun's Caraco facility in the US under class two of the FDA recall guidelines which is defined as a situation in which use of, or exposure to, a violative product may cause temporary or medically reversible adverse health consequences or where the probability of serious adverse health consequences is remote. "These products are being recalled because they were manufactured with active pharmaceutical ingredients (APIs) that were not manufactured with good manufacturing practices," FDA wrote in its note.
