Emerging pharma destination?

Visakhapatnam With (Vizag) in the race to be the capital of Andhra Pradesh, investments are pouring in. It surely has emerged as one of the most potential business destinations as APIIC has received many applications, with majority of them being pharmaceutical companies.

According to Andhra Pradesh Industrial Infrastructure Corporation (APIIC) in Visakhapatnam; it has received more than 50 applications in just a month's time, of which 22 application are from pharma companies for the allotment of lands at SEZs by developed the Corporation in various parts of the district.

APIIC received 50 Investments pour in applications for land allotments. + About 22 of these applications are from pharma companies.

Interestingly, majority of these applications are from pharma companies, seeking land to set up a base in the port city. The APPIC had begun receiving applications soon after the Parliament passed the AP Reorga-nisation Bill. If the proposals are cleared. investments worth over

Moreover, the APIIC has recently de-notified

around 1,500 acres of the 9,000 odd acres of Atchyuthapuram SEZ and earmarked certain plots as chemical and petró-chemical zones.

The Atchyuthapuram SEZ has received 22 applications from pharma companies, seeking anywhere between acres and 34 acres of land.

Even companies from other industries are making enquiries on the availability of land to set up their base. "We are

expecting more applications after polls. We already have very good land bank spread in various parts of the district. There are also some IT MNCs that have enquired about the land availability," APIIC zonal manager, V. Nagabhushan Reddy said.
